Dear :

Honeywell is ready to begin an environmental cleanup in the lower portion of the Hackensack River. The cleanup, which includes both dredging and capping river sediments, will be conducted in the river from approximately Droyers Cove to the Hudson Mall.

We will begin the project in late May or early June, staging equipment at the former Roosevelt Drive-in site. Most of the dredging and capping work will be done from the river. However, trucks will bring clean sand and other materials for use in the river to the staging area. The project should be substantially finished by the end of 2012. However, depending on weather conditions and other factors, the work may carry over into the summer of 2013.

The remedy, which was developed in coordination with the Riverkeeper, is being done under the jurisdiction of the U. S. District Court. The court has appointed a Special Master to supervise the work. In addition, Honeywell has obtained permits from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection. We have previously addressed soils and groundwater at the Roosevelt Drive-in site under the court's supervision.

We are holding a public meeting to outline the details of the remedy. Anyone interested in learning more is welcome to attend.


